Zoo InternQuest is a work-exploratory program offered through the San Diego Zoo. It's designed to give high school juniors and seniors a real-world look at biology-based and conservation jobs at the San Diego Zoo and Wild Animal Park. This internship is for students who are seriously considering careers that will benefit wildlife. This internship is NOT an animal keeper training or job shadow program. It is so much more. The program started 50 years ago as a way to find the next generation of conservation scientists!

Zoo InternQuest: A look behind the scenes of the Zoo and Park

There's more to zoo jobs than zoo keeping!

Meet scientists at work in our Conservation and Research for Endangered Species division. You might encounter experts in pathology, genetics, animal nutrition, reproductive physiology, ecology, or veterinary medicine. You may also meet the people who are hard at work saving the world's wildlife. Experts in ecology, horticulture, primates, conservation education, and condor reintroduction may show you what their careers are like. And, you will spend time with animal keepers and trainers to see how they help wildlife, too.

Zoo InternQuest applicant requirements:

- Current SOPHOMORE or JUNIOR at a high school in San Diego County (home schools included).
- A GPA of 3.0 or above
- Demonstrated interest in science, conservation, and community through extra-curricular activities
- Two letters of recommendation, at least one from a science teacher
- Good writing skills as illustrated in writing samples on application
- Computer experience
- The ability to commit to seven weeks of after-school sessions (3:00 pm to 5 pm) at the San Diego Zoo and Wild Animal Park on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays.

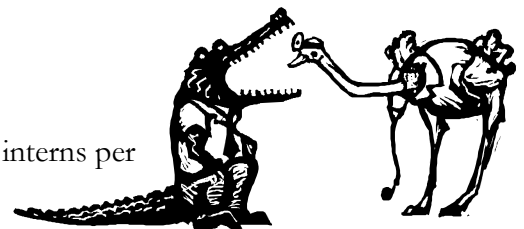

3. List of science and/or education experiences, activities, and honors (e.g., science fair, science Olympiad, summer courses, after-school classes, clubs, volunteer work, paid experience, camp counselor, teacher aide, etc.) since 7th grade.
4. Write one paragraph about your favorite animal as if you were writing for a magazine geared toward young readers.
5. Write a 500- to 1,000-word personal essay describing your interest in a Zoo-related, biology-based, or conservation-related career or field of study. (Essay will be critiqued for writing skills.)
6. Two brief letters of recommendation: one from a science instructor; and a second from a teacher, career counselor, school administrator, club leader, or other adult not related to you who can recommend you for this experience.
